1. THE PURPOSE OF THE DISCIPLINE

Education of foreign students is an important vector of the state educational program of Ukraine, a factor in the formation of the Ukrainian state as an equal partner in the creation of the world educational space and corresponds to the integration and globalization of information and cultural world processes. Language training of foreign students should take into account their needs for quality education, which will contribute to further personal growth, as well as increase the prestige of Ukrainian higher education institutions of the Ukrainian education system. Ukrainian language for foreigners is not only an educational subject, but also an educational discipline, a means of comprehensive lifelong development and a guide to future specialists in their professional development. For foreigners studying in Ukrainian universities in English or another foreign language, Ukrainian is the language of the socio-cultural environment and must be taught in order to develop intercultural communication skills. For foreign students of medical profile, a professionally oriented approach to learning the Ukrainian language is also prioritizing due to the fact that clinical classes in professional disciplines, medical practice, and sometimes internship students are held on the basis of Ukrainian hospitals, so communication skills in professional situations are necessary to communicate with Ukrainian colleagues and patients. Thus, the training of foreign students in the Ukrainian language contributes to the comprehensive development of the individual, who can conduct intercultural dialogue, as well as one of the means of obtaining vocational education.

The working program for the study of the discipline "Ukrainian language" was compiled in accordance with the Standard of Higher Education of Ukraine recommended by the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine in the field of knowledge 22 "Health Care" for specialties 222 "Medicine". Language training of foreigners is an integral component of the state Concept of Language Education and is based on the main provisions of the Constitution of Ukraine, the laws of Ukraine "On Education", the State National Program "Education: Ukraine of the XXI century", the European Charter of Regional Languages or Minorities, the Pan-European Recommendations on Language Education.

"Ukrainian language" is an academic discipline that provides for the communication needs of foreign students in the domestic, educational, professional, socio-cultural, educational and scientific spheres and the formation of communicative competence, which will contribute to the formation of the linguistic personality of the future specialist. The study, teaching and evaluation of the discipline is regulated by the General Standard in Ukrainian as a foreign language (A1 - entry level, A2 - basic level; B1 - I middle level, B2 - II middle level; C1 – professional level), approved by the Order of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine of 24.06.2014 No 750 "On the provision of educational literature vulves of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine" and correlated with pan-European competencies of knowledge of foreign languages Common European Framework of Reference – CEFR

- Basic principles of the Ukrainian Language: organization of educational process in order to form communication competence in foreign students on the basis of an integral set of skills of effective communication in domestic, socio-political, socio-cultural and educational-professional spheres; організація навчальної діяльності відповідно до комунікативних і пізнавальних потреб студентів;

- mastering language and speech competence in accordance with the main provisions of the theory of speech activity and communication; функціонально-комунікативний підхід до відбору мовного матеріалу;

- interaction between the teacher and the student as active participants in the educational process; positioning of the innocent as a subject of study;

- achieving the required level of knowledge of the Ukrainian language (B1) by foreign students after studying the discipline "Ukrainian Language" at the School of Medicine No. 2 of the State University "Uzhhorod National University".

The course took into account the state status of the Ukrainian language, its social functions; set as the main task of exercising educational, developmental and educational influences on innocent people, promoting the formation of an individual, ready for active communication in all spheres of

public life and in educational and professional activities; provides appropriate forms of organization, methods and technologies of teaching the Ukrainian language as a foreign language.

The subject of the course is modern Ukrainian literary language, taking into account adaptation, sociocultural, communicative, general scientific and professional components, represented by the main types of speech activity; norms of modern Ukrainian literary language, etiquette and culture of communication; current communicative situations represented by relevant speech acts and intensification programs.

Interdisciplinary connections: integrates with the disciplines of humanitarian, natural and social direction and at the level of use of professional normative vocabulary is in coherent connection with disciplines of medical profile.

The purpose of teaching the discipline "Ukrainian language" for English-speaking third-year students is to achieve the ultimate goals of learning, that is, practical language proficiency at the first middle level (B1), sufficient for the implementation of cognitive activity in sociocultural and educational and professional spheres, which is implemented through an integrated approach to the training of future specialists and involves the interaction of communicative, educational goals.

The implementation of the main goal is subordinated to:

The communicative goal is the main one and involves a systematic multicomponent description of the goals of communicative-oriented learning, based on the model of speech behavior of the Ukrainian language carrier. At the same time, language is a means of adaptation in someone else's environment and a means of forming a spiritually rich secondary language personality with a high level of speech competence and readiness for educational activities in higher education.

Educational goal: formation of the ability to educational and cognitive activities, scientific and professional training, self-development and self-improvement, which will ensure the successful use of the Ukrainian language as a component of professional development;

Parenting goal: formation of humanistic and scientifically grounded attitude to professional activity; active position of a medical specialist; spiritual and physical perfection, morality; respect for Ukraine and Ukrainians; development of individual abilities and creative thinking.

The overall goal of mastering the Ukrainian language as a foreign language is complex: practical (communicative), educational and educational. The solution of educational and educational problems is determined by the content (topic) of cultural, general educational, scientific and professionally oriented texts and is achieved only with the proper level of language proficiency. This is what defines the practical (communicative) goal as the main one.

- The main tasks of studying the discipline, in accordance with the goal, should be considered:
- formation of a complex of competencies (integral, general, special) in foreign students in order to master the Ukrainian language;
- promoting the adaptation of foreign students to life and study in the Ukrainian-speaking environment;
- formation of the ability to use generally used and professional vocabulary and grammatical structures in communicative acts in accordance with certain intension programs, requirements for speech activities, types of organization of texts-discourses, situations and topics of communication;
- creation and development of positive motivation for educational activities of foreign citizens, activation of cognitive activity, development of creative abilities;
- preparation of self-actual nauchalnoi dyialnosti, self-control and reflection in the minds of the osvityny process at the school; formation of the ability to self-esteem and self-improvement; the formation of a professionally competent specialist;
- education of respect for the Ukrainian people, its traditions, customs and values, Ukrainian national culture and history.

Solving these tasks in the process of learning Ukrainian as a foreign language ensures the implementation of communicative needs of students in various spheres of communication: побутовій;

- social and cultural;
- general-national;
- educational and professional.

According to the educational program, the study of discipline contributes to the formation of the following competencies among higher education applicants:

- integral: ability to solve typical specialized tasks and practical problems in the process of study or in a separate field of domestic / professional activity, which involves the use of linguistic and communicative knowledge, skills; intensification programs, strategies and tactics of Ukrainian-language communication;
- general (so-called universal): ability to acquire modern knowledge; communicate in a foreign language (at the appropriate level for the second year); the ability to process and analyze information obtained from various sources; the ability to apply the acquired knowledge in relevant communicative (practical) situations; the ability to comprehend the situation, analyze it and select certain language formulas; ability to work in a team;
- special (professional, substantive): ability to reproduce already known and recognize new lexical units, use them in appropriate communicative situations; understand the meaning of commonly used words, professionalisms, general scientific and specially scientific terms (lexical level); the ability to grammatically correctly form phrases, sentences; Answer questions and formulate them to the appropriate read or listened text (grammar level).
- the ability to properly and sufficiently use language means in the range of mainly domestic, sociocultural, as well as individual scientific and educational, professionally oriented topics; submit general information about the person, subject, phenomenon, process, event, etc. (text level); the ability to listen to the content of the message, understand the information and reproduce it (listening – monological speech); the ability to read with a high degree of independence, adapting the style and speed of reading to the proposed text;
- compare basic and secondary information of the text and summarize its content, define the topic and idea, understand the logical scheme of event deployment, evaluate something/someone; use different strategies and types of reading (trial, study, viewing, search, abstract) in accordance with a certain communicative situation; record information about what you saw or read with elements of quantitative and qualitative characteristics, evaluation using typed composite components (introduction, deployment of the topic, conclusions)

Writing the ability to exchange information related to household, educational and professional duties; produce monologic statements; to keep a story about events relevant for speakers in all kinds of time angles (speaking – monological speech); the ability to organize a dialogue; verbally and with the help of non-verbal means of communication, to implement communicative tasks; to clarify the details of the interlocutor's message, to pick up and develop his opinion (speaking – dialogue speech).

3. PREREQUISITES FOR THE STUDY OF ACADEMIC DISCIPLINE

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The prerequisites for the study of the discipline "Ukrainian language" is the mastery of the discipline "Ukrainian language" in the I - 33 courses of the educational program.

4. EXPECTED LEARNING RESULTS

In accordance with the educational program "Ukrainian Language", the study of academic discipline should ensure that applicants achieve the following program learning outcomes (NRF):

Integrative final program learning outcomes

1. knowledge of the language of daily communication and specialty as a result of formed communicative-speech, linguistic, sociocultural and active competencies; adaptation of foreign students to life and study in the Ukrainian-speaking environment;

2. the ability to use generally used and professional vocabulary, grammatical structures in communicative acts in accordance with certain programs, requirements for speech activities, types of discourse organization, situations and topics of communication;
3. creation and development of positive motivation for training and creative abilities of foreign citizens; intensification of their cognitive activity;
4. the ability to plan and carry out their own educational activities in the conditions of the credit transfer and accumulation system (ESTS) of the educational process;
5. ability to self-esteem and self-improvement, professional growth;
6. Education of respect for Ukraine, the Ukrainian people, its traditions, customs and values, national culture and history.

Results of discipline training

Practical knowledge of the language at the 1st middle level (B1), sufficient for the implementation of cognitive activity in the domestic, educational, professional and sociocultural spheres, implemented through an integrated approach to the training of future specialists and involves the interaction of communicative, educational and educational purposes.

Formation of a model of speech behavior of a native Ukrainian speaker in the process of daily communication. Representation of the language as a means of adaptation in an alien environment for the innocent and the formation of a spiritually rich secondary linguistic personality, which is characterized by a high level of speech competence and readiness for educational activities in high school.

5. DIAGNOSTIC TOOLS AND CRITERIA FOR ASSESSING LEARNING OUTCOMES

Assessment tools and methods for demonstrating learning outcomes

The means of evaluation and method of demonstration of the results of training in academic discipline is a cumulative score-rating system, which provides for the assessment of students for all types of classroom and non-audit educational activities aimed at mastering the educational load from the educational program: current, modular, final control, comprehensive qualification exam; oral and written examinations, tests, presentations, tests, project work.

Assessment of knowledge, skills and practical skills of a student in the discipline "Ukrainian language" is carried out according to the 200-th system.

Assessment of students' knowledge is carried out on the basis of results:

- ongoing knowledge control;
- **final control of knowledge – credit.**

The current control of students' knowledge is carried out in two components:

- control of systematicity and activity of the student's work during the semester;
- control over the implementation of modular tasks.

When controlling the systematicity and activity of the student's work,

- the assessment is subject to:
- attending practical classes; activity in practical classes;
- level of knowledge of program material.

Current control is carried out at each lesson. During the assessment of the assimilation of each topic, the student is assessed from 1 to 8.6 points. All types of work provided for by the curriculum are taken into account. The student should receive an assessment on each topic. Forms of evaluation of current educational activities should be standardized and include control of theoretical and practical training. The maximum number of points a student can score for current activities in the study of one module is 120.

Depending on the degree of mastering the student's educational material and the ability to operate it assessment is carried out at the following levels:

The maximum number of points that a student can score for the current academic activity for the semester for admission to the module test is 120 points.

The minimum number of points that a student must score for the current academic activity for the semester for admission to the modular test / test / exam is 72 points (this is 60% of the maximum possible 120 points). If a student does not score 72 points, he is **NOT ALLOWED** to write a module work / pass the test / exam.

Evaluation methods:

1. Methods of oral control (monologic answer of the student to a separate question of the topic of the lesson, express survey; modeling of dialogues on a given topic; request-appropriate conversation during an explanation of the problematic question in the classroom; test in the form of an oral answer)
2. Written control (ongoing testing; exercises and tasks; test work; drawing up a dictionary on topic; translation of text; a summary of a given topic or additionally studied literature; individual work; independent/control work; modular control).

Methods of practical control (if necessary, checking the content of the electronic presentation).

At the end of the semester, students perform a modular task, which is performed in the form of tests or written work. The maximum score of modular control is 80 points. Modular control work is considered to be counted if the student scored 48 points.

A student who, according to the results of control of systematicity and activity of current work in laboratory classes and independent work, received less than 72 points, and / or has unworkable classes, is **NOT ALLOWED** to modular control.

Final assessment in discipline

The final evaluation for the content module consists of the sum of points based on the results of control of the systematicity and activity of the student during the semester and the number of modular control points.

The rating system consists of:

- classroom work (evaluation of oral and written answers at laboratory classes, independent, creative work);
- modular control.

Evaluation of oral responses in laboratory classes

The assessment "excellent" implies the following requirements:

Response content:

- full presentation of the theoretical question;
 - explanation of semantic, structural, functional features and features of the concepts discussed;
 - knowledge of the necessary definitions of concepts;
- Substantiation of theoretical significance of linguistic phenomena.

Response form:

- phonetically correct speech;
 - fluency in monological speech skills;
 - meaningful and logical construction of the answer;
 - gramatic, lexically and stylistically correct language design;
- up to 4 grammatical or lexical errors are allowed.

The "good" assessment includes the following requirements:

- failure to comply with one requirement for the content or one or two requirements to the form;
- 5-6 grammatical or lexical errors are made.

The assessment "satisfactorily" provides for the following requirements:

- failure to comply with 2-3 requirements for the content or one requirement for the form;
- Up to 9 grammatical or lexical errors are allowed.

The assessment "unsatisfactory" provides for the following requirements:

- failure to comply with 4-5 requirements for the content and two requirements to the form;
- the student's response to 10 or more grammatical or lexical errors.

Evaluation of written answers in laboratory classes

1) Students' responses are evaluated by two grades:

- for the content: completeness of coverage of the topic, logical sequence of presentation of the theoretical problem, correspondence of the content of the work to the topic, style, expressive means, etc.
- for literacy: errors of grammatical, stylistic, spelling and punctuation are taken into account.

The written response is evaluated for the content:

The rating is "excellent" when:

- full disclosure of the topic;
- demonstrated logical sequence of presentation;
- the right style.

The rating "good" is given when:

- the presence of a small number of stylistic errors (no more than 1-2 per page);
- Shortcomings in covering the submitted task.

The assessment is "satisfactory" when:

- incomplete coverage of the content of the issue, problems;
- violation of the logical sequence of presentation of the material;
- insufficient knowledge of theoretical material;
- weakness of means of expression;
- Bad style.

The rating is "unsatisfactory" when:

- inconsistencies in the content of the reply topic;
- primitive knowledge of the theoretical problem;
- ineminable to properly use lexical material;
- Primitive style.

The written answer is assessed for literacy:

The rating is "excellent" when:

- has up to 4 non-rude spelling/ grammatical/ lexical errors on the page.

The rating is "good" when:

- the presence of no more than 5-6 spelling, grammatical and lexical errors.

The rating is "satisfactory" when:

- no more than 9 spelling, grammatical or lexical errors.

The rating is "unsatisfactory" when:

- more than 10 errors listed above.

Modul test evaluation criteria

The final module control is carried out after the completion of the study of all topics of the module at the last control lesson.

Students who have completed all types of work provided by the curriculum in the discipline, completed missed practical classes and scored the number of points not less than the minimum (72 points, which is 60% of the maximum 120 points) are allowed to the final module control. For students who missed classes, with the permission of the dean's office is allowed to work off academic debt until a certain date within the semester.

The final modular control consists of written work, which involves the implementation of a written lexical and grammatical test and (if possible) verification of dialogic and monologue oral speech on the basis of a list of proposed lexical topics.

The maximum number of points that a student can score for the final module control is 80 points.

The final module control is considered credited if at least 48 points are scored. Students who received a lower number of points, the final module control is not credited (the student is considered to have failed to meet the required minimum).

They have the right to reschedule the final module control according to the schedule approved by the higher education institution. According to the current regulatory framework, re-assembly of the final module control is allowed no more than twice.

The results of the modular test are added to the scores obtained during the semester test. Then the student receives the result with which he takes the test.

Criteria for assessing the final semester control

The final assessment in the discipline consists of the sum of points based on the results of control of systematicity and activity of the student's work during the semester and the final number of modular control points.

- 1) classroom work / independent work - 60% ;
- 2) modul test / test work – 40%.

The total final grade for the year consists of the sum of the points of the final semester grade for the student's work during two semesters, divided by 2, for example: $150 + 170 \div 2 = 160$ points.

Forms of final semester control are in the form of credit, and include control of theoretical and practical training.

Semester test is a form of final control, which consists in assessing the student's mastery of educational material on the basis of the results of his performance of certain types of work in practical classes and the results of modular control.

The semester test is held after the end of the study of the discipline, before the examination session.

A student is considered admitted to the semester control if he has completed all types of work provided for in the curriculum and work program, there are no unfulfilled missed classes during the year.

Students who take the test do the work, which is evaluated from scratch.

Students who agree with the scores obtained on the results of semester control and modular work, their result is recalculated automatically (exempt from credit).

Students can improve their score on the test. If a student on the test receives a lower result than he had, then the higher (previous) score is put in the test sheet.

The final test has a practical test form and is conducted on the basis of tickets drawn up in full accordance with the curriculum according to the methodology defined by the higher educational institution. The test covers the following stages: I) answers to a block of test tasks, II) oral conversation on a socio-cultural topic (story with elements of dialogue) and III) work with the text of the professional direction. The maximum number of points that a student can receive for the tasks performed by him is 200 points. The minimum number of points for answers on the test - 120 points.
